



This week we focus on our ninth DNA statement: *We are Multiplying ... we reproduce disciples, leaders and churches who will go and do likewise.* God's plan for restoring all things was the multiplication of disciples, leaders and churches.

REFLECT (10 Minutes)

Was there anything new or interesting that grabbed you from the teaching Sunday?

Take a moment to think about how you were discipled and by whom. Share a bit about this experience or relationship?

DIG DEEPER (20-30 Minutes)

Read Matthew 28:19-20. Reflect on the scripture by answering the following questions:

- 1) What do you think this scripture says implicitly about who God is?
- 2) What does this scripture say about implicitly about who you are?
- 3) What do you think these verses should mean for your life?

Before we go and make disciples it is probably a good idea to know what a disciple is. How would you attempt to describe what a disciple is? Try to think of as many different aspects of discipleship as possible.

Assess your church experience in light of Jesus' command to make disciples. Would you say that your church experience is characterized by disciple making? Why or Why not? How do you think we as a church could grow in this area?

What excuses tend to keep you from following Jesus' command to make disciples? **What do you need to do in order to move past these excuses?**

RESPOND (10-15 Minutes)

Who has God placed in your life for you to partner with in making disciples?

Who has God placed in your life right now that you can begin making into a disciple of Jesus Christ?

PRAY (10 Minutes)

Spend some time praying that God will make you into a committed and effective disciple maker. Confess any feelings of unpreparedness and insecurity. Ask Him to empower you for the ministry He is calling you to. Ask him to lead you to the right people to partner with and the right people to begin discipling.

LEADER NOTES

These questions are a guide; feel free to use/exclude ones as people may have already answered the question or talked about the theme OR if your group takes a long time to tackle one particular theme it's ok to skip over questions in the interest of time/focus.
